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# Khao Yai National Park A few facts:

- Khao Yai National Park, was established in 1962 and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- The park is the third largest in Thailand and covers 2,168 sq Km and for the most part is covered with jungle vegetation and grasslands.
- There are 3000 species of plants, 320 species of birds and 66 species of mammals.
- Its waterfalls include the 80 metre Heo Narok, and Heo Suwat, made famous from the film The Beach.

#### Year 5 Residential Kit List

#### Suggested packing list:

All items to be packed in a soft backpack - not in a hard suitcase

- 3 pairs of shorts
- 4-5 t-shirts
- Sufficient underwear and socks
- 1 pair long trousers or jogging pants
- Jumper/cardigan
- 1 change of clothes for evening
- Pyjamas/nightdress
- Swimming costume
- Light raincoat with hood/hat
- Reading books/cards
- Favourite teddy bear/soft toy
- 2 towels
- Plastic bag for dirty laundry
- Mosquito repellent (containing DEET)
- After-bite cream

- Toiletry bag (Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, hairbrush, face towel)
- Sunglasses/sunscreen
- Medication in a sealable container, must be clearly labelled, to be handed to class teacher/nurse.
- Rubber-soled shoes for river (Crocs)
- Trainers/walking shoes
- Day pack which can be carried on back.
- Water bottle with carrying strap
- Torch with batteries
- Camera (disposable or cheap digital)
- Binoculars (optional)
- A watch/travel clock

### Pocket Money

- 500 Baht maximum (small notes)
- Soft drinks, ice-cream and souvenirs
- Small purse/wallet name and class code
- Students responsible for safekeeping



### Insurance cover

Insurance costs are included within the overall costs of each trip. Whilst the school considers this level of cover reasonable and acceptable, parents should satisfy themselves that this level of cover is adequate for their own personal circumstances.
