How To.... Edpuzzle

Edpuzzle is a flipped learning video tutorial tool that allows teachers to set videos from a wide range of sources as lessons, monitor pupil viewing rates and use the videos to assess understanding by adding questions. It is fully compatible with Google Classroom and classes can be imported and synced in Edpuzzle to keep them up to date with new joiners.

As a school we have an Edpuzzle pro account, the code is rf5dyf

This code needs to be added to your account when signed into Edpuzzle to remove restrictions on the number of videos that you can set – without the pro account the limit is 20 videos. To add the code follow these steps:

Sign into EdPuzzle as a teacher using your College Google account - https://edpuzzle.com/


Once signed in as a teacher, go to your account and select Add upgrade code as shown below:




How to Upgrade to Pro

Once signed in you should import your classes by syncing to Google Classroom

- 1. Go to Classes, shown in the top right corner of the screen
- 2. Select Add a class
- 3. You will see the options 'Create a class' and 'Google Classroom' appear, select Google Classroom, as shown on the screenshot below:




4. Your list of classes from Google Classroom will appear and you can select which to import, at the bottom of the list is a blue 'Import Classes' button, click this when you have completed your selections




That is your classes imported, now you can start setting content for your classes to complete – follow the instructions below to get started.


1. Select Content on the menu in the top right. This will display the screen below, this initially displays content from teachers within the school. On the left menu is a list of content providers that can be searched and imported directly into Edpuzzle:



2. Searching directly in the search content box will initially only return content already available on Edpuzzle:




To search content from the channels, such as Youtube, select the channel from the list and then search again. You can also copy and paste links from Youtube directly into the search box to find a video that may not show in the Edpuzzle search.



You can also access Edpuzzle directly from Youtube by adding the Chrome extension as shown above. When you activate this extension the link will appear in Youtube:




3. When you have a video that you wish to use, select it and it will open in the Edpuzzle preview window:




If the video has been used by other Edpuzzle users, these versions will be shown below the video and you can create copies of other users' content and edit it, just click on the links to view these versions and select Edit to change them




4. To create your own EdPuzzle video from scratch, using a link from Youtube or another content provider, click Edit to open the editing window:



- 5. There are four options crop, voiceover, audio notes and quizzes. Note that within quizzes you can also add comments to sections of the video.
- 6. Voiceover allows you to remove the existing sound from the video and replace this with your own audio you must ensure that you record for the whole length of the video to save and overwrite the audio.
- 7. Audio notes can be added to certain sections of the video where you think a concept needs further explanation, this will pause the video and play your audio recording at the specified section.
- 8. Quizzes allows you to add written comments, ask multiple choice and longer answer questions to specific sections of the video




You select open-ended, multiple choice or comment using the question tabs circled. Multiple choice allows automatic marking as the correct answer should be identified:




- 9. When you have finished editing the video, click Finish. If you wish to save for further editing, click save.
- 10. You can then assign the video to a class by ticking the check box next to the class in the next window (shown below) and then clicking assign. The options in this window allow you to set a due date, prevent skipping of the video (ie allowing pupils to fast forward through the video) and turn on captions (CC). You can also select to post directly to the Google Classroom from here.

You can also copy a link in the next stage to post on Google Classroom along with other resources as the assignment posting feature in Edpuzzle is a little limited.




11. Once you have selected a class and clicked 'Assign' you will see the class assignment screen. Here you can post to Google Classroom and copy the link to the assignment for posting:




If you choose to post directly to Google Classroom you will not be able to edit the post before it appears on Google Classroom – you will have to find the post on Google Classroom and then edit it.

12. To share the post with instructions and other resources, click 'Share assignment', this will provide a link that you can copy and then paste into a Google Classroom assignment:




13. To view pupils' activity and assess their responses to questions set in videos, access your My Classes menu and select the class you wish to review. From here, select the video you wish to assess and you will be able to see pupil progress:



14. If you have set questions in the video, it will display the number of questions that you have to grade in the assignment:



15. To assess questions, click on the blue button and begin grading – you can mark questions as just correct, amend the marks provided and give comments. Multiple choice questions will self mark.



16. In each individual class you can review marks for each assignment set by clicking on the assignment:
