
Varjak Paw Chapter Summaries

Boasted— to show off or talk like you are the best


Accused— to say someone has done something wrong

Backed down— gave in, stopped


Certain— sure

n pain— hurting
Jnclean — dirty

Hut — small shelter or house

- The hut was as dark as midnight. It belonged to a female (girl)
 cat, with black and white fur, who had never seen a
 Mesopotamian Blue before. She was a black and white cat who
 lived in the streets and never had an owner.
- She told Varjak that cats who lived on the streets belonged to gangs and didn't have collars, like he did.
- Varjak wanted to know if she could talk to Dogs, as Elder Paw told him Dogs could help the Family. She warned Varjak that cats didn't talk to Dogs.
- The female cat let Varjak sleep in the hut during the rain, although she wasn't very **welcoming**.

Gangs— groups

Collars — a strap worn around the neck

Warned - told

Welcoming — friendly

- Varjak dreamed again. He dreamed he was in Mesopotamia and Jalal was walking next to him.
- Jalal taught Varjak the Second Skill of the Way. It was called "Awareness".
- Awareness meant that to survive in the world you need to be know what is happening around you. You need to open your senses and observe the world: what it looks like, what it sounds like and what it tastes like.
- After practising and trying many times, Varjak became so aware of his surroundings that he could 'smell fear' and knew when he was being watched.
- Finally, his **whiskers** could **notice** changes in the air and even very small movements.

Taught — past tense of the verb 'teach'

Awareness — to know that something exists or something is happening

Whiskers — long hair that grows from animal's noses

Notice — to observe or pay attention to something

- Varjak woke up wet, cold and hungry.
- Holly, the black and white female cat, had been out trying to catch breakfast.
- There was a new female cat with shaggy, chocolate-brown fur in the hut. Her name was <u>Tam</u> and she seemed friendlier and than Holly.
- Varjak told Tam and Holly his story and that he needed to find a
 dog to help him and his family from some danger, but the girl cats
 laughed at him. However, Varjak didn't mind this teasing, it was
 different than being bullied by Julius.
- Tam and Holly let him stay with them, because they knew he was lost and didn't belong to any street cat gangs.
- Tam mentioned that Varjak reminded her of Luka and all of a sudden the hut went silent.
- <u>Luka</u> was a male friend cat, who joined a gang, and shortly after that he vanished.

Teasing (tease) — to make fun of something'

Gang — groups of people (in this case -cats-)

Vanished — past tense of vanish. To disappear.

- Varjak walked through the city alone. He had never felt lonelier.
- But, he still had a promise to keep, a mission to accomplish: find a dog, take it home, beat the Gentleman and his cats and save his Family.
- The night was full of strange, unknown sounds: bells ringing, sirens wailing, things rumbling.
- Varjak saw some shiny, metal monsters racing along the road.
 Finally! Dogs! He went closer and tried to talk to them.
- Varjak touched the monster (car), it was cold, like death.
- A pack of monsters were coming towards him quickly and Varjak thought he might miss his chance to talk them.
- Varjak gathered all his strength and courage and stepped onto the road. Fierce yellow eyes glared at him. Varjak begged one of the 'dogs' to stop, but the monster didn't listen.
- The monsters got closer to Varjak with their deafening sounds, smoky breath and blinding lights. If he moved, the cars would run over him.
- This was a life-threatening experience for poor Varjak. After all his efforts, he had failed to talk to the dogs (cars).

Accomplish— (verb) to finish successfully **Courage —** (noun) to be brave

Life-threatening — (adjective) you could die

- After the violent chapter with the 'dogs' (cars), Varjak lost hope about talking to them. He was **certain** that he had failed his family, Elder Paw and Jalal. But he couldn't think about going back.
- He walked into a narrow, dark alley and noticed it was empty, except for lots of black bags with rotten smells. In the distance, he could smell meat. He was so hungry!
- He followed the scent of meat deeper in the alley. The place made him nervous. He felt danger. But the smell of meat was stronger! It was silent and shadowy. Something brushed against his shoulder. The meat didn't smell so nice close up. He moved towards the bin and suddenly 5 big tom cats jumped at him!
- Varjak was ready to defend himself, but they were too fast and easily pinned him to the ground. The biggest and strongest cat, a ginger cat, ripped his cheek with claws as sharp and white as lightning.
- The ginger cat yelled at Varjak, "THESE ARE OUR BINS, STAY OUT!" He asked, "What do you know about the vanishings?
- Varjak knew nothing. The cats didn't believe him and continued to claw him. He thought he was going to die... Until a voice said
 Leave him alone!". It was Holly. Varjak faded into black.

Certain - (verb) to be sure

Alley— (noun) a narrow path between or behind buildings

Tom (cat) — (noun) male/ boy cat

Ginger (cat) — (adjective) orange coloured cat

Alley - (noun) narrow passage or small road at the back of buildings

- In the darkness, Varjak dreamed. Jalal walked beside him. He led Varjak to the riverbank where there was a fire and a group of men. There was the tastiest smell coming from the pan. Varjak drooled, as he was still hungry.
- Varjak thought they were going to join the men, but Jalal shook his head. "You must learn to hunt and to be free. Free cats are not scavengers. Those tomcats are not true cats. They have forgotten how to hunt."
- Varjak asked, "But what do you do if you are hungry and there' nothing else but rubbish?'. Jalal answered: "A true cat is free and cannot be tied down. A free cat hunts. It never depends on anyone. It only depends on itself'.
- Varjak confessed to Jalal that he had failed his mission. However, Jalal taught him that it is not a failure to make a mistake. The important thing is what you learn from your mistakes.
- Varjak said confidently, "I want to learn how to hunt" and in that moment Jalal started teaching him the Third Skill: Hunting.

Confess(ed) - (verb) tell someone that you have done something wrong.

Cricket - (noun) an insect that makes a loud noise.



- A rough lick woke up Varjak from his dream. It caused Varjak some pain. He started to open his eyes, but he could see a white and black blur. He was still hungry.
- Varjak could see <u>Holly</u> and <u>Tam</u>. They were in a quiet, narrow alley.
 He could see something **glimmering**, but it was night. He could hear fearsome metal monsters (cars) in the distance. He could taste the smoke in the air. Fortunately, he couldn't see the ginger cat who almost killed him.
- They were in the city centre, where they were safe from the gangs.
 Holly and Tam told him that <u>Ginger</u>'s gang were in control of the
 East side of the park, and <u>Sally Bones</u> was the boss of the West.
 They warned him about Sally Bones, a white cat who should be feared.

 excited.


Lick - (verb/noun) touch with the tongue (for example: a **lick** of ice cream)

Blur - (noun) something that looks unclear or a smudge

Glimmering - (verb) shining softly

- Holly instructed Varjak to keep his head down in this part of the city.
 It was louder here, Varjak could hear the cars and people too. Tam
 stated, "This is where a lot of the Vanishings have happened".
 There was that word again... Vanishings. Varjak had to ask, "What is a vanishing?
- Tam whispered, "Cats disappear, one day they are here and another day they are gone, with no trace. Some cats think it's her...
 But she didn't finish the sentence, because she didn't like saying her name. (Sally Bones). The truth was nobody knew why the cats were disappearing or who was responsible.
- Varjak enthusiastically commented he could create his own gang with Tam and Holly. A gang were cats were not bullied, but where they could help each other and do whatever they liked. But Holly told him that he had no idea about how to survive in the city, that he was just a pet cat.

Stated - (verb) past tense of to state, to express something definitely.

Vanishing - (noun/verb) when something or somebody disappears.

Stung - (verb) past tense of to sting, to be hurt

Prey - (noun) an animal that is hunted and killed by another for food

- That night in his dreams, Varjak was back in Mesopotamia near the riverbank of the Tigris river.
- Jalal seemed to shimmer when he talked to Varjak, "What was that?, asked Varjak puzzled. Jalal answered, "I can move faster than you can see."
- Jalal taught him the Fourth Skill: Slow-Time. He started: "First of all, you must learn to breathe. Count your breaths. You must breathe more deeply, use all your lungs. After that, you must breathe slower and slower. Once you are in Slow-Time everything will seem to slow down, but you will be fast. Faster than anything!"

Shimmer - (verb) similar word for 'glimmer'

Fast (adjective) - faster than (comparative adjective) - the fastest (superlative adjective) - to be quick, to move at high speed

- During that night, Tam, Holly and Varjak were still hungry. Holly had a plan for dinner. However, Holly was worried that Varjak was so unclean. He had to wash up or else her plan would be ruined.
- Finally, he cleaned up. But in order to look like a street cat he had to stop using the **collar**. It was such a relief!
- Holly's plan was to get food, but they would have to go near Sally Bones' territory. So they set off silently, through the back streets, soon they were in the loud, harsh city. "Hide!" hissed Holly.
- There were 7 confident cats. At the head of the group was a brawny tom cat with stripy fur. His face was covered in scars. His name was <u>Razor</u>, one of Sally's soldiers.
- Finally, the road was clear and they could continue their way to a
 part of the city with tall, white buildings arranged in a square, with a
 water fountain in the centre and a huge stone column pointing up at
 the sky. There were statues of lions, magnificent and fearless, made
 of bronze.

- Unfortunately, they didn't count on the pigeons being so quick, noisy and strong with their beaks. Suddenly, the birds surrounded Holly and started pecking at her with their sharp beaks. Holly stood bravely, but Varjak could see the panic growing in her face.
- Varjak thought about the Fourth Skill: Slow-Time. He breathed slowly, he breathed in-two-three-four. Out-two-three-four. And the birds' wings... slowed... down. He dived after Holly making the birds fly away for a moment, Holly ran towards Tam and they were out of danger.

 Razor was sure that Tam had not been near Sally Bones' territory, because that was his job.
- Razor invited Holly to their gang, insisting that she could come with him, but Varjak wasn't going to accept this and he stood in his way.
 Varjak felt a paw as hard a rock on this face! SLAM! Varjak wanted to fight, but he couldn't get on his feet.
- Razor left. Blood trickled out of Varjak's mouth. Holly said kindly, "It was brave, but you can't win a fight with Razor."
- "I will beat him one day." vowed Varjak.

Insisting- (verb) to ask for something many times or with emphasis

Vowed - (verb) Past tense of to vow - to promise

- Days passed, Varjak's wounds healed and still no news of Tam.
- Varjak and Holly decided to search for Tam everywhere, including Sally Bones's territory.
- Varjak stopped in front of a toy shop and stared. He had never seen a toy before. His sense of awareness told him to search for something. He wasn't sure why or what. He found the source of the strange feeling: it came from a box..
- "I am very well thank you please" said a voice, that sounded like a robot. It was a weird cat that looked like Tam. But it wasn't a real cat. Holly knew it was a toy cat that children liked to play with.

Wound - (noun) An injury, such as a cut, stab, or tear, to a part of the body.

Healed - (verb) Past tense of to heal - to get better or to cure a disease

- Varjak dreamed again. He was walking by the Tigris with Jalal by his inside. Jalal spoke, "Your body is only a part of you. You are more than your body. You can make it do anything, if you know how. This the Fifth Skill and we call it Moving Circles."
- Jalal's body curved and became a figure of the number 8. Then
 he melted into a circle. Varjak copied Jalal, but his body shook in
 pain. After practising, the power started building up.
- "Use your power to direct the force, like this!, said Jalal, suddenly striking his paw at Varjak. Varjak's eyes widened. If he could master this Skill, he could beat anyone.

Bristly - (adjective) covered with hair.

Drool - (noun) Saliva falling from the mouth.

Fled - (verb) Past tense of to flee - to run away from a situation of danger.

Sprang - (verb) Past tense of to spring - to jump or leap.

- "There are times when it is useful to **disappear**..." said Jalal.
- Varjak was back in Mesopotamia. He was happy to be back. Jalal stood beside him in the shadow of a wall. And then, suddenly, he was gone.
- Varjak could hear Jalal talking to him, but couldn't see him.

 Believe in yourself and you can do anything."

- "That's a car! barked Cludge.
