## **Key Information:**

You should write and illustrate a mathematical story picture book that focuses on one mathematical topic.

Age 4-7: It MUST be 4 pages or less of A4 excluding the front and back cover. Age 8-11: It MUST be 10 pages of A4 or less excluding the front and back cover. It should be your own drawings and ideas! (No images from the internet) It can be hand-drawn and then written or typed. You can look at some examples of picture books in the school library that include Maths to get some ideas. ## **Extra Information from the organisers:**

- Entries must genuinely represent the work of the student;
- Only 'individual' entries are currently possible (i.e. one student/author per story). 'Team' entries are not possible at this stage;
- Each entry (or story) should clearly focus on one mathematical topic;
- Where possible, students' own drawings are strongly encouraged to avoid any copyright issues;
- The entry (or story) can be written in any sub-genre of fiction (e.g. fantasy, detective, thrillers, action, mystery/adventure, ghost story, humour, science fiction, fairy/magical tale, myths or legends, etc.);
- Entries for the 4-7 age category must not exceed four (4) A4 pages.
- Entries for the 8-11 age category must not exceed eight (8) A4 pages (excluding front and back covers);
- The front cover must contain: 1) the story's title; 2) the names of the author and their school; 3) The age of the author in years and months;
- All pages should be numbered (excluding front and back covers);
- All entries should be submitted in the 'portrait' / vertical format;
- All entries must be submitted electronically as a PDF file. (Tip: Anything written or drawn with regular pencils, once scanned, will be very hard to read and see. On the final draft, consider writing over your text and outlining your drawings with a felttip pen);
