Schedule and Participation

To help the day run smoothly and give each performance the attention it deserves, sessions will be spread across the school day:

- Year 3 8:30–9:30
- Year 4 10:30–11:30
- Years 5 & 6 1:15–2:15

In recognition that Year 6 students have already invested great energy into their Aladdin production, participation in Busking Day this year is optional. If your child chooses not to perform, they will attend a viewing time set by their teacher and continue with their learning during the afternoon session.

If your child wishes to perform, please take time to talk with them about their act; teachers will also support children in planning a performance that suits them—either solo or in a group. For those who prefer not to be on stage but would still like to be involved, we will ensure they have a meaningful and purposeful role behind the scenes.

We encourage students to practice at home and prepare any costumes or props in advance.

Guidelines and Logistics

To ensure a safe and enjoyable event, please keep in mind the following guidelines:

- No selling, competitions, gambling or services (e.g. nail painting, hair braiding, massage)
- No use of balls, water, foam, sprays, or dangerous substances
- No acts involving fighting, martial arts or weapons
